AB86 Technical Assistance Webinar: Give Feedback on Draft Implementation Guidelines

This week's webinar on Friday, July 10, will allow you to preview the current version of the draft guidelines for the implementation of the Adult Education Block Grant and offer your input.

As a reminder, The California Department of Education (CDE) and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office pulled together a balanced team to provide input into guidance for for the Adult Education Block Grant.

- Eight field representatives from K-12 and community colleges began meeting on June 15. Through the process, the focus group received input and comment from the field regarding the draft guidance.
